Stricklin, George W., 72

Former Iuka School Chief Dies

Iuka, Miss., Aug. 13—George W. Stricklin, former Superintendent of Education, died at his home early Monday. He was 72.

Mr. Stricklin had been Superintendent of Education of Tishomingo County for two terms, and it was during his terms that the county established most of the consolidated schools, replacing the one-teacher schools.

He was born in Tishomingo County. Mr. Stricklin was a member of Iuka Baptist Church.

Services will be held at the Baptist Church Tuesday at 4 p.m. The Rev. Carmon Savell and Rev. J. H. Holder will officiate. Burial will be in Mt. Gilead Cemetery near Iuka.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Pearl Fuller Stricklin; one brother, C. J. Stricklin of Houston, Texas and four sisters, Mrs. Alva Humphress of Burnsville, Mrs. Dora White of Holcut, Mrs. Pearl Pope of Booneville, and Mrs. Hattie ? [missing text] of Waynesboro, Tenn.
